When our books are a certain age sometimes they need replacing with a newer edition. We send these books to Betterworld Books, who are an online book shop which has raised millions of pounds for literacy and libraries.

They also save books from going to landfills by recycling ones they cannot sell.

Re-used books - This category is made up of the sum of books sold and donated. The re-use of these books is considered waste prevention. Reducing the volume of waste we create results in limiting the environmental impact of disposal or recycling.

Recycled books - Books the library deems unsaleable and not appropriate for donation to participating literacy partners. Recycling books is termed waste reduction. Our recyclers report that the efficiency of recycling a book yields 97% of that book as usable fibre.

A Greener NHS

In October 2020, the NHS was proud to announce as becoming the world's first health service to commit to reaching carbon net zero. Across the country different organisations are making the effort to be greener; reducing unnecessary cannulas, reducing single use plastic, day treatment areas and pharmacies using peddle power to beat the congested traffic and installing solar power. These are just a few of things that is happening now.

We can all do our bit for a greener NHS and life in general. The Trust supported a plastic free July, encouraging people to choose to refuse plastic containers when shopping, opting for their own reusable drink containers instead of the single use ones in coffee houses.
